Let me first point out that maintaining peace is an essential task of the United Nations, and that those organizations – such as the ICRC – which are confronted daily with the horrors of war can only welcome the sustained efforts being made in this domain. It implies providing to individuals what is considered appropriate to cover their basic needs.

Impartiality is therefore as much a matter of practice as of perception, and may be challenged daily by any of the parties involved.

The corresponding duty upon the State in which the conflict is

taking place is to agree to a relief action which is humanitarian and impartial in nature and whose purpose it is to provide aid essential for the survival of the civilian population, such as food and medical supplies. The tragic dimension of a growing disregard for the humanitarian ethos was brought home to us by the cold-blooded assassination of three ICRC delegates in Burundi last June and again by the horrific events that took place in Novye Atagi, Chechnya, on 17 December, in the compound of an ICRC field hospital: It should move in parallel with a political process aimed at addressing the needs of the tasks assigned to peace-keeping were no longer clearly distinct from humanitarian action, for example in contexts where they included ensuring the delivery of humanitarian relief supplies. Such political commitment is essential if peace-keeping and humanitarian action are to remain effective.
