Mid-Book Test - Easy. This will help you establish uniform criteria for grading essays even though students may be writing about different aspects of the material.

One group should report on Dave's negative behavior, positive behavior, and Get The Lost Boy from Amazon. They require more thought than multiple choice questions, but are shorter than the essay questions.
